Application of that process needs to be clearly defined, agreed and articulated for future Marine Park buyouts.			
	It was noted that Industry representatives are pursuing matters in relation to this motion through an external avenue in another forum. The DPI representative advised it would be inappropriate for DPI to discuss this issue in detail until the external actions initiated by industry personnel were finalised. Industry representatives sought advice from the DPI Scientist (present as an Observer) as to his involvements in then Marine Park decisions. The DPI scientist noted that he was not consulted over the marine park buyout process and only provided catch data.

3 (3)	Structural Adjustment DPI provided a history of the development and implementation of the share management framework. It was reiterated that the share management framework was developed to provide a specific mechanism to adjust the number of endorsements, if required. That is, if it were determined that more or less divers are needed to maximise economic performance, the minimum shareholding to be eligible for an endorsement can be changed. A regulatory tool, as opposed to a market based incentive, may be needed to facilitate such adjustment. Industry representatives raised the issue of a separate 'dive entitlement' in response to the recommendations of the TAC Committee, and requested advice from DPI about progress against the Committee's recommendation. DPI noted that the issue of a separate "dive entitlement" (as opposed to the current endorsement issued by way of the fishing business card) had been considered as part of the environmental assessment process and that the current legislative framework does not provide for a separate and transferable "dive entitlement". Industry representatives raised the limitations and delays of using minimum shareholding to adjust diver numbers, and observed the successful use and advantages of separate 'dive entitlements' as used in the Tasmanian and Victorian abalone fisheries. Motion: Industry Representatives Industry seeks an assurance that if an endorsement were not active (i.e. quota has been transferred) then the endorsement will not be cancelled.

	DPI advised that under current NSW legislation, if a fishing business holds the minimum number of shares required to be eligible to an endorsement, that endorsement will be issued (subject to eligibility, suspension or cancellation of endorsement provisions in the <i>Abalone Share Management Plan Regulation 2000</i> [AbSMP] and associated regulations) regardless of whether all quota has been transferred to another shareholder. Therefore, if the fishing business owner chooses not to activate that endorsement for any reason, their right to that endorsement will not be cancelled provided the minimum shareholding and "fit and proper" requirements outlined in regulations are satisfied.

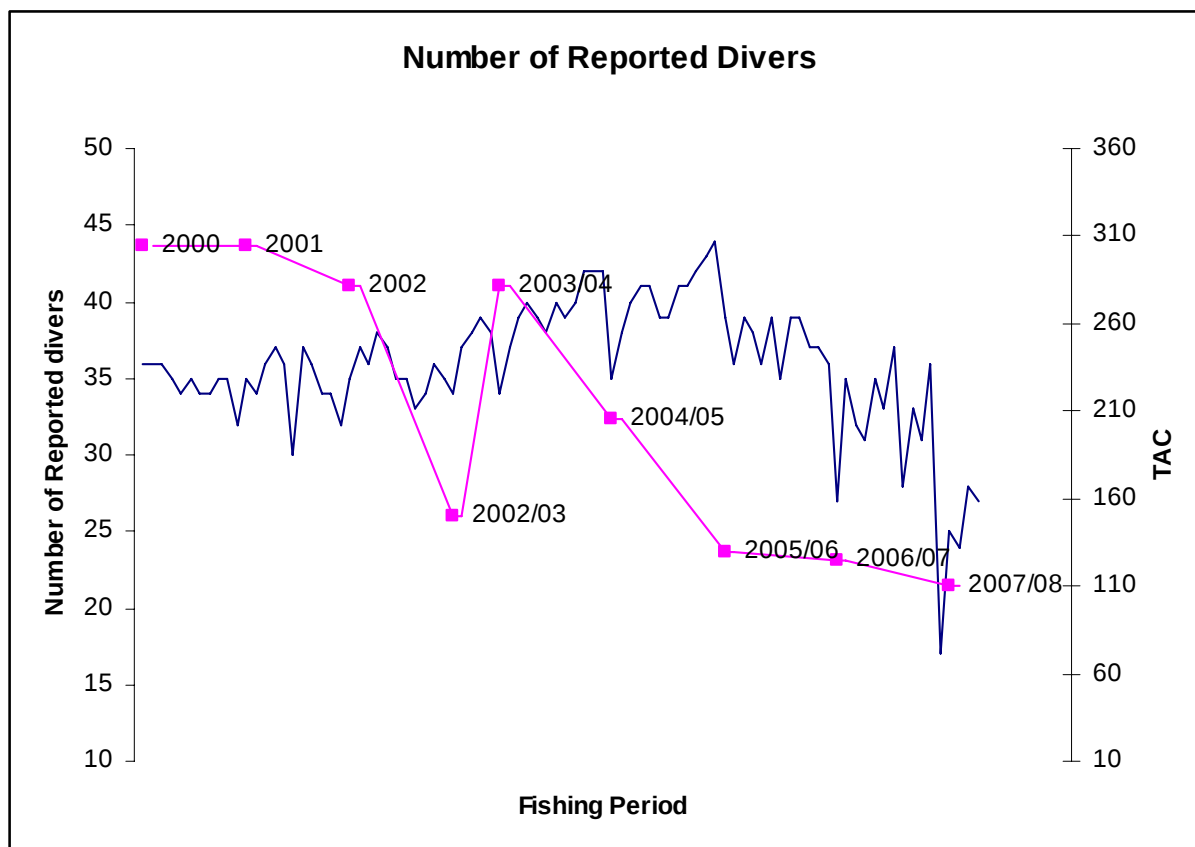


Figure 1. Number of abalone divers graph reporting by month since the implementation of the abalone share management plan in February 2000.
