Industry

Issue

Agenda items submitted by Industry Representatives

Background

A number of items were submitted by Mr Miller for inclusion on the agenda - refer appendix 7.

Many of these items relate to specific agenda items and will be discussed under those items. Where relevant, DPI advice is provided on issues.

Closure of Region 1 and 2

Update the science behind the closure of the northern part of Region 1 and Region 2, and the consultation and planning prior to implementation of the closure. Industry members are concerned by the lack of science behind closure of the northern part of Region 1, the problems with the assessment of Region 2, the lack of consultation about closure following the repeat of the TAC Committee's recommendation about catch and information from the area, and the lack of any plan for management of the area as intended in the FMS. Industry members will propose a motion to reopen the areas, within the 110 t TAC, to sustainable and structured commercial fishing and to provide information about stocks in the area. - Refer agenda item 5(b)

Update Marine Park buyout progress

Update progress and plans related to the buyout of abalone shares to compensate for Marine Park closures. Industry members request information about calculation within each subzone of the amount of shares for the buyout, including particularly provision of information used to estimate the areas of reef alienated. Further, they also request information about how Shareholders were selected for the buyout to ensure the removal of the appropriate amount of effort from subzones in the northern part of the Batemans Park. Industry members will propose a motion expressing concern at the inappropriate method for calculation and inappropriate number and distribution of shares in the buyout and that an independent process is need to review the decision.

DPI response

180 and 20 Abalone shares were removed from the fishery as a result of the implementation of the Batemans Bay and Port Stephens Marine Parks respectively.

Correspondence to the AbMAC dated 8 January 2007, 31 January 2007 and 15 May 2007 outline the process undertaken with regard to the buyout - refer appendix 8

TAC timetable and MAC input

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendation for MAC meetings to inform assessment and reporting process for TAC. Industry members do not believe this recommendation has been appropriately dealt with and will propose a motion to facilitate improvements for next year. Refer agenda item 11

Structural adjustment

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendation about structural adjustment, including consideration of options for a dive entitlement as requested at the March 2005 meeting of AbMAC. Industry members will propose a motion to request advice about and recommend the use of a separate class of shares to be associated with the entitlement to dive.

DPI response: The EIS process considered this issue. Management response 4.1(b) of the final approved FMS states that:

Manage the number of divers by implementing appropriate minimum shareholding limits, allowing greater competition among divers and providing for more flexibility for shareholders to adjust their individual shareholding.

Advice is sought from the MAC with regard to the appropriate minimum shareholding in response to this management response.

Finer scale management

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendations on finer scale management and catch monitoring. Industry members will propose a motion to support the process for Industry finer scale stock assessment, with catch targets and monitoring plan. - Refer agenda item 4

Variable size limits

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendation on variable size limits. Industry members have already requested a regulation to increase the size limit south of Wonboyn, with a clear process for Industry to reverse or extend size limit changes further, and an agreed process for prior reporting. Industry members will propose a motion to support this size limit increase in such a way. - Refer agenda item 4

Management Charges

Update expenditure report for 2005/06 and 2006/07 fishing periods. Industry members have repeatedly requested project/activity based budget and expenditure reports, as recommended by IPART, and will again propose a motion in support of this. Industry members request advice about calculation of the contribution of the budget on behalf of recreational and commercial sectors in the 2005/06, 2006/07 and 2007/08 budget, and why this amount was changed from that advised to the MAC on 19 April. Industry members have requested for some time reductions in service levels and more cost efficient management services, and will again propose a motion in support of this. Industry members will also propose a motion of support of a deed limiting total management and other costs to a fixed percentage of the GVP similar to other states abalone fishery. Industry members request a detailed project activity based budget for proposed Management Charges in 2007/08, and the current level of outstanding Management Charges.

DPI response: The 2005-06 expenditure report was forwarded to the AbMAC on 12 July 2006.

The 2006-07 expenditure report is at appendix 3.

As advised on 18 September 2007, the management charge for 2007-08 has been determined at \$168.40 per share. This includes a savings provided to industry of 6% for the benefit received by the recreational sector and a 6.6% saving in recognition of restricted access to the sanctuary zones within NSW marine parks. In 2007-08 the level of overheads attributed to industry was reduced from 27% to 24.5%. In addition, the department is continuing to bare compliance costs with only 2 Officers being levied to industry in recognition of the parlous state of the industry. The adjustments are consistent with the broad pricing principles recommended by IPART. As a result of the above savings, the charge in 2007/08 is approximately \$109 per share less than it would have been without these adjustments.

Recreational Catch

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendations to more accurately estimate the recreational catch and review bag limits and opening time.

DPI Response: The recreational bag limit for abalone in NSW was reduced from 10 to 2 on 1 July 2005. The Department is seeking support from the Advisory Council on Recreational Fishing to conduct a robust survey to identify the recreational abalone catch in NSW. Recreational management has an initial survey underway to identify people who take shellfish so that we can develop a subsequent targeted survey.

Economic Information

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendation that data and analysis on the structure, conduct and performance of industry be improved. Refer agenda item 6

SIAC representative

Industry members wrote to NSW DPI over a year ago with nomination of representatives for SIAC, and request an update on progress. Industry members will propose a motion to support nomination of representatives from ABMAC.

DPI Response: The nomination process for an abalone representative on SIAC is underway. The members of the AbMAC will be notified once the appointment is finalised. Note that Mr G Warren attended the last SIAC meeting as an observer.

EIS budget and FMS

Update progress on the FMS and the latest EIS budget, and any additional costs attributed to Industry.

DPI Response: The updated budget for the EIS/FMS process was emailed to the AbMAC representative on the Joint Abalone Working Group on 1 June 2007- refer Appendix 9.

Sitting fees and allowances

Update progress and plans on procedures for determining appropriate meetings for payment of sitting fees. Industry members will propose motions in support of payment for certain meetings if necessary

DPI Response - refer correspondence dated the 4 June and 5 July 2006 and the 13 April 2007 Appendix 10.

Industry Code of Practice

Funding from the DEET through the Fishing Industry Training Committee has allowed the development and consultation on an Abalone Council of NSW, Industry Code of Practice. Update progress on development and consultation on the Code of Practice, to be implemented by November in line with the FMS.

DPI response: This is an industry initiative. DPI is willing to assist with the process where appropriate.

Keniry report

Update on progress and plans on recommendations of the Keniry Taskforce report

DPI Response: A number of reports have been prepared that consider scientific, management, and compliance aspects of the abalone fishery, including those prepared by Mr Mick Palmer, Dr John Keniry, the Total Allowable Catch Setting and Review Committee, and the Abalone FMS. The Department is progressively developing and implementing consolidated responses to the findings and recommendations arising from these reports, within the context of the approved FMS.

SUTS management changes and REF

Update progress and plans on catches and management of the SUTS fishery and REF

DPI Response:

Background

The Regulation under the NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (EP&A Act) was amended by the NSW Minister for Planning in September last year with the result that any 'non-designated fishing activities' (including SUTS fishing) (pursuant to a fisheries authority that is issued or renewed for 12 months or less) does not require formal environmental assessment under the EP&A Act to be completed before 31 December 2008.

A sustainability assessment is required under the Commonwealth Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act) for approval to export product taken by the fishery.

In preparation for the approvals process, draft 'Management Arrangements' and 'Review of Environmental Factors (REF)' documents were distributed to MAC members for comment. At the time, some people highlighted likely errors in the data presented and requested that the draft documents be changed before being forwarded to the Commonwealth Government for public exhibition and assessment under the EPBC Act to be completed before 31 December 2008.

Current position

The data problems raised by members at the time were fixed and incorporated into revised draft documents which now need to be updated and forwarded to MAC members for final comment before they are sent to the Commonwealth Department of the Environment and Water Resources for exhibition and assessment. When finalised, the documents will also form the basis for the formal environmental assessment required under the EP&A Act post December 2008.

1. Endorse the current methodology for undertaking the stock assessment for the fishery or recommend any necessary improvements with regard to:

- retaining the 1994 biomass target or adopting a specified alternative, and
- whether or not to proceed further in the development of finer scale management of the fishery, including any alternative monitoring and assessment methodologies and industry involvement.

2. Endorse the current minimum legal size limit for abalone or adopting a specified alternative limit(s).

3. Specifying any other priority actions to rebuild and maintain the sustainability of the abalone fishery into the future, having regard to the objectives of the Fisheries Management Act 1994 and the matters identified in the TAC Committee's Report, the approved Fishery Management Strategy and the export approval issued by the Commonwealth Government.

A science forum was also approved by the Minister and will be held on the day prior to the MAC meeting. This forum will provide an opportunity for the SARG to discuss the above issues.

Permits issued under section 37 of the Act have been issued to interested applicants endorsed in the abalone fishery since July 2007, to harvest abalone from Region 1 (between Port Stephens and Wreck Bay) under scientific observation. A verbal update on the region 1 survey and the Perkinsus report will be provided to the Committee.

c) Committee Representatives Update:

AbMAC representatives will have the opportunity to provide a verbal update on the abalone fishery.

NSW DPI has a statutory responsibility to ensure that the fishery is operating consistently with the Act, the Plan and FMS. The role of the commercial management unit is to develop, implement and review strategies for the sustainable and equitable use of the NSW abalone resource. This includes monitoring the objectives, performance indicators and trigger points of the Abalone Share Management Plan and to examine performance against effective and cost efficient management in the abalone fishery.

Economic productivity

An 'Economic productivity and business analysis for the NSW Abalone Share Management fishery is currently underway.

The study will be conducted in two stages with progression to Stage 2 being dependent on NSW DPI's review of the findings of the first stage and subsequent direction.

Stage 1

- assess the potential of the NSW abalone fishery to achieve greater economic productivity for shareholders, other industry entities and the broader community, using the current arrangements as a comparative baseline;
- identify any major existing factors (both industry and government) that are likely to be impeding the realisation of any such potential economic productivity;
- identify broad options to realise any such potential economic productivity, including alternative private or public governance arrangements (eg. a single abalone harvesting company); and
- quantify the likely magnitude of the potential greater economic productivity for each option.

Stage 2

- develop a detailed business model with respect to a selected preferred option, including a description of the option (eg including governance arrangements), an analysis of risks (to both shareholders and the NSW Government) and risk mitigation strategies, and any necessary transitional arrangements;
- identify any major existing or potential factors (both industry and government) that are likely to impede the adoption of the preferred model; and
- advise on the public policy and governance arrangements necessary to implement the preferred model, if different to the current arrangements.

Acil Tasman Economic Consultants have been engaged by NSW DPI to undertake this study.

Issue

Proposed Regulation amendments relating to Abalone Fishery

Background

A number of regulation amendments relating to the Abalone Share Management Fishery Plan to achieve outcomes specified in the Fishery Management Strategy and to achieve consistency with other share management fisheries and recent licensing reforms are proposed.

- Proposed amendments to Clause 2 Definitions

Include definitions consistent with those included in other share management plans. For example, Clause 39A adopts part of the Fisheries Management Supporting Plan set out in the *Fisheries Management (Supporting Plan) Regulation 2006*, and it is desirable to include a definition within the Abalone SMP. For example '**Supporting Plan** means the *Fisheries Management Supporting Plan* as set out in the Appendix to the *Fisheries Management (Supporting Plan) Regulation 2006*.'

- Proposed amendments to Clause 3 Objectives, performance indicators and triggers for review

To achieve consistency with the Abalone FMS and other new share management plans it is proposed to amend the Table to Clause 3 of the Abalone SMP by replacing the objectives, performance indicators and triggers for review. A table of proposed objectives, performance indicators and triggers for review is set out below for discussion, noting that some may require amendment following recommendation of the SARG.

OBJECTIVE 1. Contribute, in conjunction with other fishing regulatory controls (as defined in section 7A of the Act), to managing the impacts of the fishery on the environment and to ensure ecologically sustainable development

- Proposed amendments to Clause 6 Maximum shareholding

It is proposed to amend Clause 6 to set a maximum shareholding in the fishery at 40% of the shares originally issued in the fishery consistent with the intent of section 72 (2) of the *Fisheries Management Act 1994*, which states:

If no maximum shareholding is fixed in the plan, the maximum shareholding is 5% of the number of shares in the fishery at the commencement of the plan.

- Proposed amendments to Clause 7 Dealings in shares—general

As required under the FMS, it is proposed to increase the flexibility of share transfers between shareholders by amending Clause 7 to allow the trading of small numbers of shares, including single shares. The ability to trade 1 or more shares will only be applicable where the shareholder selling the shares retains 10 or more shares after the transaction and the buyer already holds a minimum of 10 shares before the transaction. In other situations the minimum package of shares that can be bought or sold should continue to be 10.

- Proposed amendments to Clause 8 Special provisions relating to transfers

To simplify the administrative processes associated with the transfer of shares and provide shareholders increased flexibility in trading shares and quota it is proposed to amend Clause 8 (3) of the *Abalone SMP*. The *Abalone SMP* should only require the transfer of unused quota with shares if the shareholder is transferring all shares and is not retaining shares in the fishery. Where the shareholder retains some shares in the fishery they should be able to retain the quota or transfer it to another shareholder in accordance with Clause 18 of the *Abalone SMP*.

- Proposed amendments to Clause 10 Nominated fishers

It is proposed to amend Clause 10 of the *Abalone SMP* to specify that in addition to the current requirements that prevent a person being nominated, a person may not be listed as an “eligible fisher” if the conditions set out in the clause are applicable.

- Proposed amendments to Clause 13 Nominated fisher to notify shareholder of alleged offence

It is proposed to delete this requirement as it is rarely used and appears to be a matter for the parties involved in an employer /employee relationship. If retaining this clause it should be amended to read "within 24 hours of being apprehended for an offence" as the charge may not occur until some time later

- Proposed amendments to Clause 15 Determination of quota

It is proposed to remove the requirement in Clause 15(5) for the Director General to notify nominated fishers of the quota available with respect to a shareholding. Shareholders would be responsible for notifying their nominated fishers.

- Proposed amendments to Clause 18 Transfer of quota

It is proposed to remove the limitation on aggregation of quota as far as possible within the constraints of the intent of Section 79 (2)(a) of the *Act*.

Subject to the management plan:

2(a) A shareholder may not acquire by any such transfer more than twice the amount of the shareholders actual allocation

- Proposed amendments to Clause 22 Limited use of unauthorised crew

It is proposed to amend this clause to allow holders of both Class 1 and 3 licenses to act as crew in the abalone fishery.

Proposed amendments to Clause 33 Monthly reconciliation

It is necessary to update the provisions of this plan to cater for new flexible nomination provisions. Under the new licensing provisions it is conceivable that an "endorsement holder" may have worked for several shareholders in a month or that a shareholder may have employed several nominated fishers over a month. It is desirable that this occurs without requiring the logbooks be reissued with each change.

It is proposed to amend Clause 33 to allow for a system where reconciliation books are issued for the use of the shareholder. Similar to the requirement in Clause 290B of the General Regulation it is proposed to require that a shareholder (or a person nominated by the shareholder to complete the reconciliation on their behalf) be required to complete the monthly reconciliation.

Provision for shareholders to nominate a third party to keep their records is desirable as shareholders may not be a natural person or may not be involved in the day to day running of the business. Nominated persons should however be subject to similar requirements and penalties as would be applicable to the shareholder under Section 122 of the *Act*.

It may be necessary to include provision to allow shareholders to change nomination of the person who will complete the reconciliation and transfer the reconciliation book to a new person. This would require that the outgoing person completes the relevant portions of a reconciliation book, prior to handing the books across.

Provision to require that endorsement holders supply the nominated record keeper with the information necessary to complete the reconciliation may be required, similar to provisions within Section 122(5) of the Act which already require that the information be supplied to the "Fishing Employer".

- Proposed New Clause under part 6 - Records to be made by commercial fishers

It is proposed to insert a new clause under Part 6 'Provisions relating to crew, boats, records and other matters' of the Plan, outlining the daily reporting arrangements for abalone fishers. Currently, clause 290A of the *Fisheries Management (General) Regulation 2002* governs the requirements for abalone nominated fishers to make a prescribed record of fishing activities within a relevant fishing period, that is a day.

It is proposed to amalgamate the relevant requirements relating to the abalone fishery under clause 290A of the FM(G) Regulation into the Abalone SMP.

- Proposed New Clause – Sorting of undersize abalone

It is currently an endorsement condition that an endorsement holder "Not have in his/her possession any prohibited size abalone in or on any water other than 10 prohibited size abalone which may be in possession on the licensed fishing boat while abalone diving operations are underway. All undersized abalone must be returned to the seabed by hand before the end of diving day."

The intent of this condition is to allow undersize abalone onboard the vessel as part of the measuring and sorting process. It would be expected that the diver would then return any undersize individuals to the water, near where they were taken.

This condition will be placed in the management plan as opposed to appearing on the Fishing Business Card.

- Proposed New Clause – Taking species other than abalone.

It is currently an endorsement condition that an endorsement holder "Unless otherwise endorsed to do so, the endorsement holder must not, while using any apparatus to facilitate breathing underwater take any fish other than abalone or be in possession of any such fish while in possession of any such apparatus in, on or adjacent to any waters or while such apparatus is in, on or attached to any boat being used by the endorsement holder." The intent of this condition is to prevent endorsement holders retaining other species.

This condition will be placed in the management plan as opposed to appearing on the Fishing Business Card.

Issue

Actions required for industry to maintain its export approval and comply with the requirements of its Wildlife Trade Operation authorisation.

Background

The Commonwealth Government has imposed a number of conditions in its Wildlife Trade Operation (WTO) for the NSW abalone share management fishery. Failure to comply with these conditions would mean that export approval would be terminated. The required conditions (Appendix 4) are:

1. Operation of the fishery will be carried out in accordance with the *NSW Fisheries Management (Abalone Share Management Plan) Regulation 2000* in force under the *NSW Fisheries Management Act 1994*.
2. NSW DPI to advise the DEH of any material change to the NSW Abalone Fishery management arrangements that could negatively affect the assessment of the fishery against the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* criteria, within three months of that change being made.
3. A report to be produced and presented to DEH annually, and to include:
 - a) information sufficient to allow assessment of the progress of NSW DPI, in conjunction with industry and other stakeholders, in implementing the conditions and recommendation made;
 - b) the status of the Abalone Fishery performance indicators compared to the trigger points
- 4) The FMS for the NSW Abalone Fishery to be finalised and approved by the end of April 2007
- 5) The NSW DPI, in conjunction with NSW Abalone Fishery stakeholders, to develop and implement within 12 months an agreed recovery strategy for abalone stocks across the fishery that defines the following:
 - precautionary recovery targets and associated timeframes;
 - specific measures to promote the rebuilding of stocks to target levels; and
 - stock and catch monitoring and compliance measures required to evaluate and enforce the recovery of depleted stocks.

NSW DPI has indicated to the Commonwealth department that it would be willing to explore ways that NSW might be able to adopt the Commonwealth's specific recovery requirements once these are known, as part of the State arrangements for the management of the fishery. Note that the Commonwealth cannot compel NSW to implement its requirements, but the Commonwealth can make binding requirements on industry.

Representatives of Dept of the Environment and Water Resources will also attend the meeting to discuss this approval and explain the revised Guidelines for the Ecologically Sustainable Management of Fisheries and the reporting and information requirements under the new agreed process. Issue

The Abalone Fisheries Management Strategy (FMS)

Background

As required under the NSW *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*, an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) was prepared in 2005, covering abalone fishing activities. In conjunction with the EIS, a draft Fishery Management Strategy (FMS) was prepared outlining a series of goals, objectives and strategies for achieving the objectives as well as performance indicators and associated monitoring programs. The Final FMS was approved in April 2007. The EIS addressed the assessment requirements for export approval under the Commonwealth *Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*.

The FMS identifies target timeframes for implementation of individual management responses. The management responses listed in the table below have a short implementation timeframe and require prioritisation to ensure completion using the available resources.

Issue

Biosecurity issues

a) Marine Pests

Background

Marine pests are plants or animals, usually introduced from overseas, that have a significant impact on our marine industries and environment. They can include mussels, crabs, seaweeds, sea stars and other marine species. However, not all marine pests are from outside Australia. Some are native to other regions of our country and have been transported into NSW.

Marine pests have been introduced to and moved around Australia by a variety of human-induced means. These include ballast water and sediments, biofouling (marine organisms that attach to objects immersed in salt water), aquaculture operations and aquarium imports.

How could marine pests affect the commercial fishing industry?

Marine pests can cause considerable economic damage and environmental impacts. These impacts can be felt by marine industries such as commercial fishing. For example, in Tasmania shellfish farmers and fishers have been affected by the introduced Northern Pacific seastar, a voracious predator which consumes a range of shellfish. Other pests may entangle in boat anchors, fishing nets and trawling gear leading to increased catch sorting times and reduced efficiency. In NSW, some areas have been closed to netting due to the presence of the invasive green seaweed *Caulerpa taxifolia*.

Significant marine pests in NSW

Significant marine plant and animal pests already established in NSW include:

- Aquarium Caulerpa (*Caulerpa taxifolia*)
- European/ Green shore crab
- New Zealand screw shell and
- European fan worm

There are other introduced species which have become established in marine waters outside of NSW, and are considered a potential threat to our marine biodiversity and fishing industry if transported here. These include the Northern Pacific seastar, Japanese seaweed / wakame, European clam and Asian green mussel.

What is the government doing?

In order to protect industry and the environment, NSW Department of Primary Industries is working collaboratively with the Australian Government and other state and territory governments to implement a National System for the Prevention and Management of Marine Pest Incursions.

The National System has three major components:

1. Prevent the introduction and movement of marine pests within Australian waters
2. Provide a coordinated emergency response to new incursions and translocations and
3. Manage and control marine pests already in Australia

A communications program is part of the National System. This program will focus on raising community awareness on marine pests and what different industries can do to help protect themselves from marine pests.

How can industry protect itself?

Many operators are ahead of the game and already take actions which help prevent the spread of marine pests. However, we'd like to encourage operators in your fishery to learn and practice what extra they can do to protect their livelihood.

Please encourage operators to:

1. Learn and follow the best practice guidelines to protect your fishery from invasive marine pests.
2. Learn how to recognise marine pests and report sightings.

These actions will assist in preventing a major marine pest incursion which could affect your fishery.

b) Ganglioneuritis Update

The recently found Herpes like virus, Ganglioneuritis, has significantly affected localised abalone stocks in Victoria. Reports have indicated there is a 90% mortality rates in known areas with this disease. The Victorian government has implemented a temporary closure to attempt to contain the disease. It is believed that the disease spread naturally (through environmental conditions), however the spread maybe enhanced by waterway users (divers, surfers etc).

It is important for both industry and the NSW DPI to develop strategies and practices to minimise the affects of the above disease and any future diseases that may threaten NSW abalone stocks. The developed strategies could include options for opening and closing fishing grounds (as listed under management response 2.2 (c)) and developing hygiene protocols for standard operating procedures to prevent likelihood of spreading such a disease.

The Aquatic Biosecurity section of the NSW DPI has developed a proposed outline for sampling of *Ganglioneuritis* in NSW. The outline of this project was sent to all AbMAC representatives on 28 August 2007.

Currently, there is no clinical evidence of this virus occurring in NSW. Sampling will be undertaken to establish a baseline of current conditions, the knowledge of which could be useful in the management of any potential outbreaks. This project is being fully funded by the NSW Government.

INDUSTRY POSITION PAPER FOR MANAGEMENT CHARGE BUDGET

Summary

The 2005-06 Management Charge budget proposed by DPI involves a continuation of existing service levels, which leads to a >12% increase in costs of managing the fishery compared to 2004-05. The Management Charge budget proposed by Industry identifies several key areas to improve the cost-efficiency of management. These include greater expenditure on Industry Development and Resource Enhancement, and a reduction in the Management Charge to Shareholders to help facilitate repayment of debt. Expenditure on Industry Development in particular is likely to lead to significant long-term cost-efficiencies in managing the fishery over the budget proposed by DPI.

The total budget proposed for 2005-06 by DPI represents a >12% increase on 2004-05, and is in contrast to the greatly reduced TAC and revenue in the fishery in recent years (i.e. >40% reduction), and likely TAC in 2005-06. Savings to Industry and DPI could be achieved through reduced service levels in several main areas:

1. Reduction in Compliance staffing from 4 Officers to 2. Industry support the continuation of 4 dedicated Compliance Officers for abalone, but can not afford to pay for these services at the expense of initiatives related to Industry Development and Resource Enhancement.
2. Reduction in the costs of Research services through outsourcing of the Fishery Independent Surveys. In addition to improved cost-efficiency through outsourcing, improvements in information for stock assessment are likely through greater Industry Development, in cooperation with the successful multi-state FRDC-supported project "Abalone Industry Development: local assessment and management by industry".
3. Reduction in Management staffing from 1 FMO to 0.5. Efficiencies in management staffing will be possible through a greater role of an Industry entity in services such as secretarial support for the MAC, printing and distribution of docket books etc.

Industry has proposed an alternative budget that will contribute to three significant outcomes. These include expenditure on two new line items and a saving to be returned to Shareholders:

1. Industry Development. Industry propose funding for a unified entity to represent their best interests and facilitate the development of more cost-efficient Fishery Management services. A proposal has been developed for the entity with independent, professional Chair and Directors responding to the democratic advice of Shareholders. In addition to the ongoing development of more cost-efficient management services and novel approaches to data collection for stock assessment by Industry, it is hoped the entity will also be able to use the funding to increase leverage of funds from other sources and receive significant in-kind support from Industry. An indicative budget for the Industry Development line item is as follows:

2. Resource Enhancement. Industry propose funding for a range of methods to enhance the abalone resource, which are included in the draft Fishery Management Strategy and associated EIS. In particular, these include methods of reseeded abalone reef with juveniles raised in a hatchery and movement of brood-stock, rehabilitation of abalone habitat, and investigation of the potential of variable size limits. Industry believe the application of these methods will lead to a more productive abalone resource for all Stakeholders. Industry are also investigating the potential for the contribution of matching funds from other sources, and significant in-kind support will come from Industry. An indicative budget for the Resource Enhancement line item is as follows:

3. Saving to Industry. Almost \$800 000 of fees and charges are currently outstanding from at least 38 of the 48 shareholders, in addition to many Shareholder's outstanding debt related to fishery access costs. With the currently reduced TAC and revenue, there is little ability to repay these debts. The MAC support a saving in Management Charges being returned to Shareholders to help facilitate repayment of this debt.

The table below compares the Management Charge budget proposed by DPI with that proposed by Industry. Notes are provided to explain variations among the budgets. As summarized in the recent MAC minutes, a final recommendation on a Management Charge budget for 2005-06 is pending advice about the determination of the TACC, the DPI review of oncosts and overheads, the outsourcing of Research services and potential defrayment of increased DPI staff costs.

No additional justification or explanation of budget line items is possible, as none has been provided by DPI, despite MAC requests. Oncosts (26%) and Overheads (61%) are calculated as a percent of Salary. Departmental Contribution (Savings) is calculated as 20% of Salary and oncosts, plus 30% of Overheads. Recreational Contribution calculated as 14% of Total Expenses (not including contribution to Industry Development), and Industry Contribution calculated as 86% of Total Expenses plus Industry Development line item. Numbered notes refer to below:

1. Reduction in FMO to 0.5 FTE.
2. Reduced Salary component of Management budget through reduced staffing, oncost and overheads.

VARIATION TO DECLARATION OF APPROVED WILDLIFE TRADE OPERATION

I, LARA MUSGRAVE, Delegate of the Minister for the Environment and Heritage, hereby vary under subsection 303FT(7b) of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act), the Declaration of an Approved Wildlife Trade Operation dated 28 November 2005 for the harvesting of specimens that are, or are derived from, fish or invertebrates, other than species listed under Part 13 of the EPBC Act, taken in the New South Wales Abalone Fishery, as defined in Schedule 1 of the New South Wales *Fisheries Management Act 1994*:

1. Revoke condition a):
Is valid until 28 November 2006.
2. Include a new condition a):
Is valid until 28 November 2008.
3. Revoke condition b) and the Schedule (dated November 2005):
Is subject to the conditions applied under section 303FT specified in the November 2005 Schedule.
4. Include a new condition b) and Schedule (dated November 2006):

**Declaration of the Harvest Operations of the New South Wales (NSW) Abalone Fishery as
an approved Wildlife Trade Operation**

ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS (section 303FT)

Relating to the harvesting of fish specimens that are, or are derived from, fish or invertebrates, other than specimens of species listed under Part 13 of the Act, taken in the NSW Abalone Fishery.

1. Operation of the fishery will be carried out in accordance with the NSW Abalone Share Management Plan 2000 in force under the *NSW Fisheries Management Act 1994*.
2. NSW Department of Primary Industries (DPI) to advise the Department of the Environment and Heritage (DEH) of any material change to the Abalone Fishery management arrangements that could negatively affect the assessment of the fishery against the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* criteria, within three months of that change being made.
3. A report to be produced and presented to DEH annually, and to include:
 - a) information sufficient to allow assessment of the progress of NSW DPI, in conjunction with industry and other stakeholders, in implementing the conditions and recommendations made; and
 - b) the status of the Abalone Fishery performance indicators compared to the trigger points.
4. The Fishery Management Strategy for the NSW Abalone Fishery to be finalised and approved by the end of April 2007.
5. NSW DPI, in conjunction with NSW Abalone Fishery stakeholders, to develop and implement within 12 months an agreed recovery strategy for abalone stocks across the fishery that defines the following:
 - precautionary recovery targets and associated timeframes; —
 - specific measures to promote the rebuilding of stocks to target levels; and
 - stock and catch monitoring and compliance measures required to evaluate and enforce the recovery of depleted stocks.

Management

Closure of Region 1 and 2

Update the science behind the closure of the northern part of Region 1 and Region 2, and the consultation and planning prior to implementation of the closure. Industry members are concerned by the lack of science behind closure of the northern part of Region 1, the problems with the assessment of Region 2, the lack of consultation about closure following the repeat of the TAC Committee's recommendation about catch and information from the area, and the lack of any plan for management of the area as intended in the FMS. Industry members will propose a motion to reopen the areas, within the 110 t TAC, to sustainable and structured commercial fishing and to provide information about stocks in the area.

Update Marine Park buyout progress

Update progress and plans related to the buyout of abalone shares to compensate for Marine Park closures. Industry members request information about calculations within each subzone of the amount of shares for the buyout, including particularly the provision of information used to estimate the areas of reef alienated. Further, they also request information about how Shareholders were selected for the buyout to ensure the removal of the appropriate amount of effort from subzones in the northern part of the Batemans Park. Industry members will propose a motion expressing concern at the inappropriate

method for calculation and inappropriate number and distribution of shares in the buyout, and that an independent process is needed to review the decision.

TAC timetable and MAC input

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendation for MAC meetings to inform assessment and reporting process for TAC. Industry members do not believe this recommendation has been appropriately dealt with and will propose a motion to facilitate improvements for next year.

Structural adjustment

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendation about structural adjustment, including consideration of options for a dive entitlement as requested at the March 2005 meeting of ABMAC. Industry members will propose a motion to request advice about and recommend the use of a separate class of shares to be associated with the entitlement to dive.

Finer scale management

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendations on finer scale management and catch monitoring. Industry members will propose a motion to support the process for Industry finer scale stock assessment, with catch targets and monitoring plan.

Variable size limits

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendation on variable size limits. Industry members have already requested a regulation to increase the size limit south of Wonboyn, with a clear process for Industry to reverse or extend size limit changes further, and an agreed process for prior reporting. Industry members will propose a motion to support this size limit increase in such a way.

Management Charges

Update expenditure report for 2005/06 and 2006/07 fishing periods. Industry members have repeatedly requested project/activity based budget and expenditure reports, as recommended by IPART, and will again propose a motion in support of this. Industry members request advice about calculation of the contribution to the budget on behalf of the recreational and commercial sectors in the 2005/06, 2006/07 and 2007/08 budget, and why this amount was changed from that advised to the MAC on 19 April. Industry members have requested for some time reductions in service levels and more cost-efficient management services, and will again propose a motion in support of this. Industry members will also propose a motion in support of a deed limiting total management and other costs to a fixed percentage of GVP similar to other states abalone fishery. Industry members request a detailed project/activity based budget for proposed Management Charges in 2007/08, and the current level of outstanding Management Charges.

Recreational catch

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendations to more accurately estimate the recreational catch and review bag limits and opening time.

Economic information

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendations that data and analysis on the structure, conduct and performance of the industry be improved.

SIAC representative

Industry members wrote to NSW DPI over a year ago with nomination of representatives for SIAC, and request an update on progress. Industry members will propose a motion to support nomination of representatives from ABMAC.

EIS budget and FMS

Update progress on the FMS and the latest EIS budget, and any additional costs attributed to Industry.

Siting fees and allowances

Update progress and plans on procedures for determining appropriate meetings for payment of siting fees. Industry members will propose motions in support of payment for certain meetings, if necessary.

Industry Code of Practice

Funding from the DEET through the Fishing Industry Training Committee has allowed the development and consultation on an Abalone Council of NSW, Industry Code of Practice. Update progress on development and consultation on the Code of Practice, to be implemented by November in line with the FMS.

Keniry report

Update progress and plans on recommendations of the Keniry Taskforce report.

SUTS management changes and REF

Update progress and plans on catches and management of the SUTS fishery and REF.

Compliance

Regional offences detected and prosecutions, including commercial operators

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendations about management and estimation of illegal catches. ABMAC has requested for some time, and it is an action item from the previous 2 MACs, a report on the number of offences detected and successful prosecutions in each region of the fishery, and for commercial abalone, other commercial and non-commercial sectors. Industry members will again propose a motion that this is reported to all MAC meetings.

Time/resources for compliance in the commercial fishery

ABMAC has requested for some time, and it is an action item from the previous 2 MACs, a detailed estimate, including a breakdown by each activity/project, of the time and resources required to manage compliance of the commercial abalone fishery, and a comparison to the lobster fishery. This should include description of the number of inspections of commercial divers boats/catches within each Region.

Prior reporting proposal for size limit regulation

The TAC Committee and Industry has requested variable size limits enforced through an appropriate regulation. In supporting a regulated size limit increase, Industry proposed prior reporting through processors. Update progress and plans for prior reporting related to the variable size limit regulation, including any concerns with prior reporting through processors and detail to any alternative proposal. Industry members will propose a motion supporting prior reporting through processors.

Greater penalties and resourcing for theft.

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendations for greater penalties, particularly as an indictable offence for specific commercial quantities, and greater resourcing for theft. Industry members will propose a motion supporting the need for greater penalties, particularly as an indictable offence, and greater resourcing for theft.

Research

Explanation for budget and expenditure

The research component of the budget involves staff and operating, but it is not clear what activities/projects are budgeted for or where the budget is spent. Update progress and plans of expenditure on the research budget, including action items from the last 2 MACs about expenditure in past years by activity/project. Industry members will propose a motion supporting the need for budgeting by activity/project, and agreement on activities/projects being cost-efficient or necessary, as suggested by IPART.

Region 1

Update progress and plans for the survey in Region 1. Industry members will propose a motion supporting the need for a timetable to consider results of the survey with the TAC Committee and future management of Region 1. This will also refer to the development by Industry and DPI of a proposal for an urgent structured fishing survey in the northern part of Region 1.

Region 2

Update progress and plans about the TAC Committee recommendation for Region 2.

Industry members will propose a motion supporting the finer scale assessment and proposal for finer scale catch targets and monitoring of catches, and the development of a proposal by Industry and DPI for an urgent structured fishing survey in Region 1.

Stock assessment for TAC

Update progress and plans about the independent survey, particularly with respect to concerns of representivity, such as in Region 2. Update progress and plans over how the stock assessment model is behaving (i.e. retrospective analyses as requested by the TAC Committee) and being used (i.e. management targets decided by the TAC Committee), particularly with respect to concerns expressed by Industry members. Industry members will propose a motion not to proceed with survey or model this coming year, and for it to be replaced with a more cost-efficient and representative assessment from structured commercial fishing surveys in selected areas. This will also refer to the development by Industry of the use of GPS and depth loggers in the fishery.

Perkinsus report

Update progress and plans on the Perkinsus report.

National disease survey report

Update progress and plans on the National disease survey report.

Formal correspondence from Industry members of the MAC to NSW DPI since last MAC meeting. Copies of all correspondence and any relevant replies to be tabled.

I refer to your enquiry regarding the calculation of number of abalone shares to be bought out as part of the Batemans Marine Park (BMP) buy out process.

The marine parks in NSW are zoned to allow for a range of different activities within the boundaries, however, the implementation of sanctuary zones will impact the abalone fisheries through loss of some fishing grounds. This impact on abalone fishing areas is used to calculate the number of shares to be bought out.

Catch returns submitted by commercial fishers from the years 1996 to 2005 were used to determine a historical proportion of catch in sub-zones within the fishery. This provided an indication of the importance of each sub-zone for the fishery over these years.

Each sub-zone was assessed independently when identifying the percentage of lost abalone ground. The amount of reef suitable for abalone fishing inside the sanctuary zones was calculated as a percentage of the total reef inside the sub-zones. Resources used during the assessment process included habitat maps and the final zoning plan. A proportion of impact on each sub-zone in the abalone fishery was determined by multiplying the proportion of catch in the sub-zones affected by the marine park and an estimated percentage of lost abalone ground.

Finally, the estimated proportional reduction in catch resulting from the sanctuary zones was multiplied against the total number of shares in the abalone fishery to determine the number of shares that will be acquired as part of the Batemans marine park buy out program.

I appreciate your concern and I am willing to discuss your concerns further. I do not, however, believe it is necessary to schedule a meeting at this point. If you have any further concerns or require any additional information please put these to me in writing and I will investigate any matters raised and respond to you promptly.

I refer to your letter of 12 January 2007 regarding the proposed buy out of shares in the Abalone fishery and compensation for the SUTS fishery.

NSW Department of Primary Industries (NSW DPI) sent abalone shareholders a letter on 18 December 2006 advising that it is anticipated to purchase up to 20 abalone shares for the Port Stephens-Great Lakes Marine Park buy out program and up to 180 abalone shares for the Batemans Marine Park buy out program. The letter also advised that the closing date for the return of the Registration of Interest form has been extended until 28 February 2007 to allow shareholders to review the final zoning plans for the marine parks. Shareholders have until 28 February 2007 to submit, modify or withdraw from the buy out of Abalone shares.

NSW DPI has previously explained in a letter to Mr Jim Miller dated 8 January 2007 how the proposed number of abalone shares for buy out was calculated. NSW DPI acknowledges that assumptions were made in calculating the number of shares for buy out. However, given the information currently available, certain assumptions were unavoidable when making estimations as to the amount of reef available for abalone fishing and the productivity of different sections of the reef.

You express concern that the proposed 200 abalone shares to be bought out is insufficient to compensate for the sanctuary zones in each of the marine parks. However, you have not provided any further specific information that could be used to justify adjusting this figure.

In your letter you request a clear statement about the influence of outstanding abalone management charges on both the assessment of tenders and on those shareholders who are selected for buy out. Outstanding abalone management charges will not be considered when selecting shareholders for buy out. However, for those shareholders who are selected for buy out, all outstanding fees will need to be paid before NSW DPI makes final payment.

With regards to the probity of informing abalone shareholders as to the number of shares to be bought out, we have sought the advice of an independent probity advisor who has been commissioned to ensure the integrity of the program. The probity adviser has reviewed your letter and advised NSW DPI that, in his view, there are no probity issues in this matter. He noted that:-

- a) the invitation to participate in the buy out was sent to all relevant shareholders;
- b) the price and the criteria are known to all who received an offer; and
- c) there is no compulsion on any shareholder to participate in the buy out.

Further, he considers that the process meets all the fundamental tenets of probity, namely, fairness, accountability and transparency. He has confirmed that there are no conflicts of interest amongst those administering the program and has assured NSW DPI that appropriate levels of confidentiality are being maintained.

Finally, in your letter you request information about the buy out program for the Sea Urchin and Turban Shell (SUTS) fishery. The SUTS fishery is a restricted fishery and is not currently considered to be fully fished. As such, a buy out program is not required as fishing pressure can be shifted to areas that are not currently fully fished outside the marine parks.

Thank you for your letter of 27 April 2007 concerning a response to previous correspondence of 8 March and the proposed buyout of shares in the abalone fishery.

I note the letter addressed to Bill Talbot on 8 March 2007 was responded to by Ms Renata Brooks, Deputy Director General for Agriculture, Fisheries and Regional Relations along with letters you sent to Hon Ian Macdonald, MLC, NSW Minister for Primary Industries and Hon Bob Debus MP.

In your letter to me you request advice about the head of power used to acquire and terminate shares. As specified in the *Fisheries Management Act 1994*, shares are surrendered under Section 74 (1) in return for a payment and cancelled under Section 74 (3).

You also request advice on who is responsible for the assessment of 200 abalone shares as an appropriate level of compensation for the marine park zoning restrictions. Shares to be acquired as a result of the Batemans and Port Stephens – Great Lakes Marine Park buy out programs are approved by the Director-General, Department of Primary Industries and the Marine Parks Authority. As specified above, shares are not purchased, but surrendered to the Minister in return for a payment.

Finally you request information on who is responsible for the decision to provide compensation to the Sea Urchin and Turbin Shell (SUTS) fishery as a result of marine park zoning restrictions. The decision not to run a buy out program for the SUTS fishery is made by the Director-General, Department of Primary Industries and the Marine Parks Authority.

When going through the detail, I picked up a few errors on the last reports sent to you (ie. from May to Oct 05) and so have fixed them and attach revised versions covering that period. I also attach new sheets for the periods 'Nov 05 to Jun 06', 'Jul 06 to Sep 06', and 'Oct 06 - May 07'.

With respect to the earlier versions that have been revised, the changes include:

- reducing the 'oncost & overhead' factor to 0.75 from 0.81 consistent with the changes made to the general abalone fishery budget (commencing from 05/06 fiscal year)
- incorporating the public sector-wide salary increase, implemented on 1 July 2005
- fixing the dates and description of some of the payments in the 'specific and external costs' sheet, which Grant has since had clarified by TEL
- fixing the "Revised Project Budget" total on the budget summary page (1st page) so that it doesn't simply mirror the "Original Project Budget" figure.

A small amount of work remains on the project (ie. printing), so there will probably be one more budget report before the project is finalised.

PAYMENT OF SITTING FEES, MILEAGE AND TRAVEL EXPENSES

Please be advised that the Advisory Council / Committee members now have additional payment options in relation to sitting fees and associated travel expenses incurred in connection with attending council/committee meetings.

The payment options which are now available are as follows:

1. Submit a Tax Invoice (sample attached) where you have an ABN with registration for GST purposes; or
2. Submit an Invoice (sample attached) where you have an ABN without registration for GST purposes; or
3. The organisation you represent may elect to submit a Tax Invoice, or
4. In the event that you are not carrying on an enterprise, therefore have no ABN, circumstances may allow you to provide a 'Statement by a Supplier - no ABN'; (sample attached) or
5. Request payment via NSW DPI payroll with deduction of appropriate income tax in accordance with the Tax Declaration supplied.

Existing Council/Committee members have been advised of the new payment options and been given the opportunity to alter their current payment arrangements. A copy of the advice sent to all current members is attached.

Please also be aware that the Crown Employees (Public Service Conditions of Employment) Reviewed Award 2006 was also recently varied to only permit the Department to pay the lower casual motor vehicle allowances where an Advisory Council/Committee member uses their private motor vehicle to attend meetings.

This change means that Finance and not Staff Payroll Centre, will process all mileage allowance. Motor vehicle allowances will remain assessable income

and will be shown on your PAYG Summary where the Advisory Council/Committee member has elected payment of the sitting fee via the payroll (i.e. a deemed employee).

In this regard it might also be noted that whilst a deemed employee must have a private motor vehicle comprehensively insured to claim mileage allowance when using the vehicle to attend meetings, a non-employee member has an additional option. Non-employee Council/Committee members (ie those who are not paid sitting fees or who elect to be paid their fee via the Finance system) can complete an indemnity form or provide a comprehensive policy to support a mileage claim. Alternatively, all Council/Committee members, irrespective of employee status can continue to claim reasonable, actual travel expenses when attending meetings.

Advisory Council/Committee members have been similarly advised of this change.

The Department is conscious that these ongoing changes (dictated by Tax Rulings/Award changes) have caused confusion and concern, however, the situation in relation to the processing of payments and associated administration has now stabilised. The Department apologises for any inconvenience caused.

Please see the attached process document in relation to the administrative management of Boards and Committees. In summary, the Staff Payroll Centre (SPC) receives all initial documentation with the SPC **only** processing sitting fees where payroll option is chosen, and nothing else. Finance will process **all** mileage and travel related expense claims (irrespective of payment option chosen), and sitting fees where a non-payroll option is selected.

Your assistance in confirming and where necessary, explaining the new payment arrangements at the next Council/Committee would be greatly appreciated.

6. SPC similarly tracks member responses and forwards the *Advisory Council/Committee Member Details Form* and any related comprehensive insurance and registration copies received at that time to Finance Branch where non payroll payment option is chosen and retains copy (of the Member Details Form) for placement on the relevant Council/Committee file. Finance will be responsible for pursuing and tracking any outstanding paperwork thereafter. A copy of the Member Details Form is also to be forwarded to the relevant contact officer so they are aware of the payment option chosen.
7. SPC follows up outstanding documentation (relevant to processing via payroll) via the contact officer in the first instant.
8. Thank you for your letter of 5 June 2006, received in response to my correspondence of 27 February 2006, with regard to your ongoing claims for remuneration payable to members of the Abalone Management Advisory Committee.

As you are aware, Premier's Memorandum 2004-10: Guidelines for Board and Committee Members' Appointment and Remuneration (the Guidelines) specifies payments that may be made to committee members. Paragraph 3 - Allowances, specifies that "Members ... are reimbursed the actual cost of travel ... associated with their role on the Board." I am advised that for the meeting in Sydney that you attended on 14 to 16 April 2005, accommodation was arranged in close vicinity of the venue, to keep travel costs and time to a minimum. Any travel between meeting days was therefore of a private nature, and not liable for reimbursement.

With regard to insurance coverage for attendance at meetings, I can advise that members of committees are covered for any injury arising out of or in the course of official duties, 24 hours a day, including travel between their place of abode and place of employment, but excluding travel by air. This cover is therefore not related to the length of a meeting.

The Premier's Guidelines specify full day and half day meeting fees. I understand that the meetings with NSW Treasury were approximately one hour in length, and therefore remuneration has been made at the half day rate.

I note that you have also requested advice on arranging support from the MAC for payments. I also note that the Director, Wild Harvest Fisheries wrote to industry members of AbMAC on 2 February 2006 requesting consideration of appropriate criteria for the types of meetings for which members should be paid, including seeking input from all shareholders. This is the appropriate way for this matter to be progressed. However, I understand that no advice has been received to date.

I write to you regarding an earlier request made by some industry members of Abalone Management Advisory Committee (AbMAC) to be paid sitting fees and associated allowances to attend non MAC meetings. The previous correspondence between AbMAC members and NSW DPI refers.

I note that the industry members have not provided further advice on the specific types of non MAC meetings for which they consider payments should be made. I also note that some AbMAC members may be planning to attend meetings as part of the TAC Committee's forthcoming process to determine the abalone TACC for 2007/08, and that this is the type of non MAC meeting for which members may seek to receive payments.

I wish to reiterate that NSW DPI's in principle support for further exploring the concept of offering to pay all AbMAC members to attend non MAC meetings was dependent on (i) NSW DPI seeking the views of all abalone shareholders on the expenditure of the funds raised in part through their payment of the share management charges for the abalone fishery, and (ii) there being sufficient funds available in the annual budget to meet such additional costs.

I believe that there is now insufficient time prior to the TAC Committee meeting(s) to enable NSW DPI to undertake a reasonable consultation process with all abalone shareholders. I also note that a number of shareholders have not paid their invoiced charges for 2006/07.

Accordingly, sitting fees, accommodation, travel or associated expenses will only be paid when members are attending formal AbMAC meetings.
